## 2025 UHA Annual Meeting January 26, 2025 Outpost Performance Space 2:00 to 3:40 p.m.

Attendees: 17 neighborhood and area residents and business people, City Councilor Nichole Rogers, Laura Kuehn (Albuquerque Police Department), and Lindsay Wood.

- 1. Board Vice President Margie Trosterud called the meeting to order and welcomed everyone.
- 2. Councilor Nichole Rogers discussed some of the recent happenings in District 6, including her website being updated, she was involved in 192 neighborhood meetings in 2024, Participatory Budgeting and District 6 funding needs from the city and state legislature. Throughout the meeting, the Councilor answered questions and provided additional information.
- 3. Laura Kuehn discussed 2024 crime statistics, which showed reductions except in burglary, and new neighborhood watch programs. She reminded everyone of the importance of reporting crimes, as such calls for service are used to determine the number of officers assigned to each area.
- 4. Margie Trosterud discussed some of the activities of the board in 2024, including the upcoming Historic Designation of parts of the neighborhood.
- 5. Don Hancock and Joseph Aguirre discussed Lead and Coal, including the Comprehensive Traffic Study. The Lead-Coal Task Force will discuss the draft report at the January 29 zoom meeting. There will be a comment period and the final report is scheduled to be completed by the end of February. The options of speed reduction, one lane, two lanes and additional enhanced safety measures were discussed and questions were answered.
- 6. Lindsay Wood lives in the Sycamore Neighborhood and is developing a Nob Hill area news to be started in April 2025.
- 7. Election of board members: No one volunteered to serve on the board except some of the 2024 members, including Margie Trosterud, Gene Trosterud, Don Hancock, Marlene Brown and Sherry Smith. Also listed as 2024 board members who might want to remain on the board were Delilah Montoya, Peggy Neff, and Brian Stinar.
